Dialogue is a foundational feature of social life and an important way in which we come to understand one another. In situations of controversy, dialogue is often absent because of a range of social barriers. *Brokered Dialogue* is a method for promoting respectful interactions among those with seemingly divergent views on a controversial topic and for discovering critical points of convergence that may represent pathways for improvement. This presentation introduces the *Brokered Dialogue* method and explores its potential value in addressing current challenges in political discourse.
