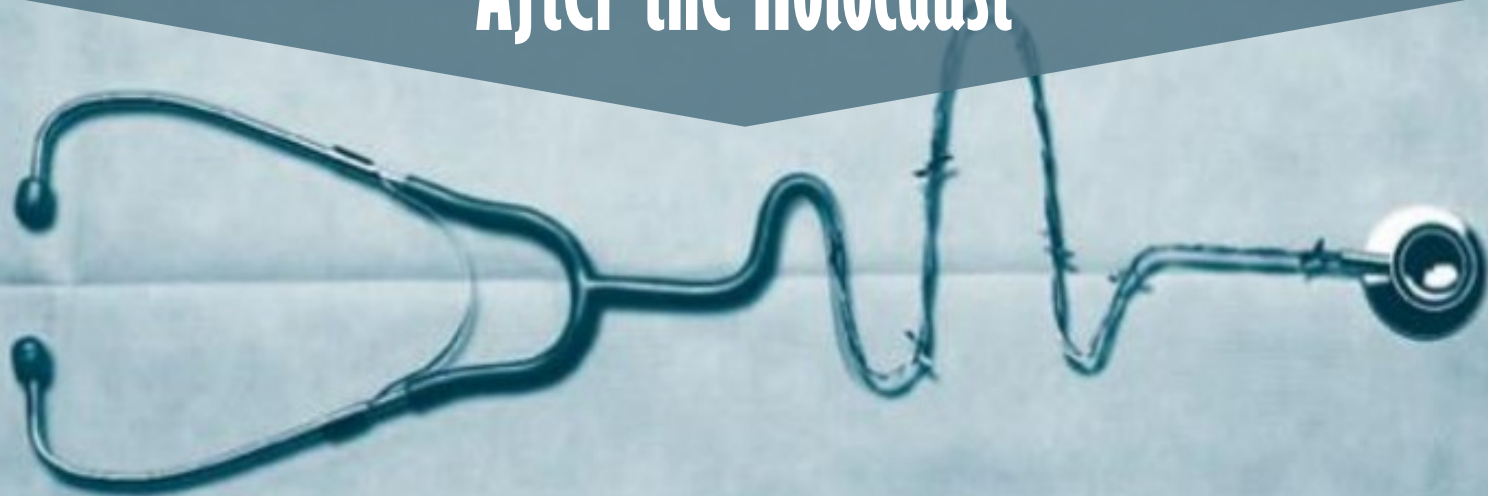


# The Integrity of the Doctor-Patient Relationship After the Holocaust

- The transformation of the medical ethos by Nazi physicians, the best in the world at the time, offers a cautionary tale for patients, doctors, and healthcare policy makers at the dawn of the twenty-first century.

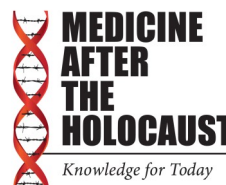
