Dr. Ehrlich is a member of the National Academy of Sciences, a MacArthur Prize fellow, and the recipient of the Crafoord Prize of the Royal Swedish Academy of Science, which is given in lieu of a Nobel Prize in fields where the Nobel is not awarded.
