The Neuroethics Program is proud to announce Neuroethics Travel Awards open to graduate and undergraduate students in any discipline who will be presenting work that discusses topics at the intersection of neuroscience and ethics.

### **Deadline for applications: May 31, 2013**

Sponsored by the Emory Center for Ethics and the Neuroethics Program, and funded by the Emory Neurosciences Initiative, the Neuroethics Travel Awards provides support from \$100-\$250 for Emory graduate and undergraduate students to travel to a conference.

### Support:

The Neuroethics Travel Award will provide up to \$250/student to defray costs for conference travel/presentation.

### Eligibility:

- Applicants must be current Emory University undergraduate or graduate students.
- Students must be presenting a topic related to neuroethics at a conference/symposia.
- Students must be primary author(s)/presenter(s) of the work.

### Requirements:

Awardees will be required to write and submit a blog post for The Neuroethics Blog about the conference and the work presented at the conference within one month after conference attendance. Support can be used toward any relevant conference occurring by Dec 31, 2013. Funds will be disbursed no later than August 31, 2013\*.

### To apply applicant must submit:

1. Conference Abstract/Abstract acceptance if available\*
2. Conference Information/URL including conference date and deadline for abstract submission
3. Curriculum vitae
4. Cover letter with brief explanation of how this work relates to neuroethics, statement of financial need and requested amount.

\*Evidence that abstract was selected by conference organizers must be provided before funds are disbursed.
