Organization's Mission Statement: The mission of the IRC is to help people whose lives and livelihoods are shattered by conflict and disaster, including the climate crisis, to survive, recover and gain control over their future.

Summary of organization's primary programs and services:

The Health Team assumes a pivotal role in ensuring the provision of essential medical and mental health services to refugees. This involves orchestrating the initial health screening at the Board of Health for all newly arrived refugees and parolees. Subsequent to the completion of their Initial Health Screening (IHS), the team promptly connects refugees with primary care providers for necessary follow-up medical services. Moreover, the Health Team facilitates the linkage of school-age children with local clinics to ensure they receive required school immunizations.

In cases of urgency or emergencies, we expedite access to urgent care or the Emergency Room (ER) and promptly inform the local Board of Health to streamline the IHS process. Additionally, beyond facilitating connections with various healthcare providers, the Health Team aids in coordinating transportation through the Uber funding system. This initiative aims to

alleviate the high demand for transportation requests from IRC logistics case aides.

- Conduct follow-up calls with clients who have recently visited medical providers to gather valuable information about their upcoming appointments, follow-up care, and assessing their experiences visiting the healthcare offices.
- Coordinate and advocate for refugee clients' healthcare needs.
- Engaging with data entry, analysis, and administrative tasks related to health services.
