Artist, essayist, and philosopher Megan Craig will discuss her 2016 multimedia, participatory installation, The Way Things Felt. The work, supported in part by the National Endowment for the Arts, intersects with Craig's ongoing research into embodiment, sensation, color, synesthesia, and autism. Working together with individuals from Chappel Haven, a school and transition program in West Haven, Connecticut that servers over 250 adults with a variety of abilities and needs, Craig collaborated with a range of

community members to create a public work that could be welcoming for all. Craig will share thoughts about the development of The Way Things Felt, aspects of her research into color and synesthesia, talk about the relationship between synesthesia and autism, and discuss the challenges of creating meaningfully inclusive public, participatory installations.
